#### • Invasive Species Program

Please consider offering up a few hours of your time this summer as an Invasive Species volunteer this summer.

Volunteer stewards are needed to inspect boats launching at the West Lake launch during the early morning and late afternoon periods to examine incoming boats when paid staff are not present.

We also need volunteers to help inspect and survey the lake for potential invasive species growth and monitor aquatic weed growth.

The AIS committee will meet in April or May to plan for the season. We have many great volunteers. We would like to see some younger lake residents step up and help keep the lake free of invasive species for future generations.

#### • The Kane Mountain Steward Program

The CLCA works with the NYS Forest Fire Lookout Tower Association and the DEC to provide volunteer stewards for Kane Mountain Fire Tower. In 2024, stewards helped greet and educate over 1,850 visitors and averaged over 78 visitors per day from June through September! 2025 will mark the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Kane Mountain!
